

- Leave shelves in place so children may not easily climb inside.
- Have refrigerant removed by a qualified service technician.

### WARNING

These guidelines must be followed to ensure that safety mechanisms in this appliance will operate properly.

### **Electrical information**

- Plug the appliance into its own dedicated 115 Volt, 60 Hz., 15 Amp, AC only electrical outlet. The power cord of the appliance is equipped with a 3-prong grounding plug for your protection against electrical shock hazards. Plug it directly into a properly grounded 3-prong receptacle. Install the receptacle in accordance with local codes and ordinances. Consult a qualified electrician. Avoid connecting the appliance to a Ground Fault Interrupter (GFI) circuit. Do not use an extension cord or adapter plug.
- If the power cord is damaged, an authorized service technician should replace it to prevent any risk.


- Never unplug the appliance by pulling on the power cord. Always grip the plug firmly, and pull straight out from the receptacle to prevent damaging the power cord.
- Unplug the appliance before cleaning and before replacing the AC LED light bulb to avoid electrical shock. Use only a 5-watt or less AC LED light bulb.
- Performance may be affected if the voltage varies by 10% or more. Operating the appliance with insufficient power can damage the compressor. Such damage is not covered under your warranty.
- Do not plug the unit into an electrical outlet controlled by a wall switch or pull cord to prevent the appliance from being turned off accidentally.

### IMPORTANT

Turning the appliance controls to **off** will disable your appliance's cooling system, but does not disconnect the power to the light bulb and other electrical components. To turn off power to your appliance you must unplug the power cord from the electrical outlet.


### IMPORTANT

#### CFC/HCFC Disposal


#### **Cleaning your Appliance**

Remove tape and glue residue from surfaces before turning on the appliance. Rub a small amount of liquid dish soap over the adhesive with your fingers. Rinse with warm water and dry with a soft cloth.

This Use & Care Manual provides general operating instructions for your model. Use the appliance only as instructed in this Use & Care Manual. Before starting the appliance, follow these important first steps.

### Location

### WARNING

This appliance is intended for use in residential household and similar interior applications such as:

- a kitchen/kitchenette
- a pantry room
- a basement
- an enclosed garage
- other interior residential-type environments
- Choose a place that is near a grounded electrical outlet. Do Not use an extension cord or an adapter plug.
- If possible, place the appliance out of direct sunlight and away from the range, dishwasher or other heat sources.
- Install the appliance on a floor that is level and strong enough to support a fully loaded appliance.

### WARNING

DO NOT install the appliance where the temperature will drop below 0°F (-18°C) or rise above 110°F (43°C). The compressor will not be able to maintain proper temperatures inside the unit.

Do not block the lower front of your appliance. Sufficient air circulation is essential to operate your appliance properly.



### Installation

Allow the following clearances for ease of installation, proper air circulation, and plumbing and electrical connections:

 Sides & Top
 ¾ in. (10 mm)

 Back
 1 in. (25 mm)


If your appliance is placed with the door hinge side against a wall, you may have to allow additional space for the handle so the door can be opened wider.

#### Guidelines for final positioning of your appliance:

- All 4 corners of the cabinet must rest firmly on the floor.
- The cabinet should be level at the front and rear.
- The door should be level.

#### Setting the anti-tip bracket:

Models are equipped with an anti-tip bracket. The anti-tip brackets are located on the lower front corners of the cabinet. Lower the anti-tip on each side clockwise until they contact the floor. Do not raise the cabinet.




Anti-tip Bracket


#### I NOTE

The direction in which your appliance doors open (door swing) can be reversed, from left to right or right to left, by moving the door hinges from one side to the other. A qualified person should reverse the door swing.

### IMPORTANT

Before you begin, turn the appliance temperature control to **off** and remove the electrical power cord from the wall outlet. Remove any food from door shelves.

- 1. Unplug your freezer.
- 2. Remove the top hinge cover (see Figure 1A).
- 3. Remove the 3 screws from the top hinge using a Phillips<sup>™</sup> screwdriver or 5/16" wrench. Set the hinge and screws aside (see Figure 1B).




### DOOR REMOVAL/REVERSAL (UNITS WITH TEMPERATURE CONTROL INSIDE)

- Gently pry the hinge bearing out from the top of the freezer door with a flathead screwdriver (See Figure 2A).
- Install the hinge bearing on the opposite side of the door (see Figure 2B). Remove the door from the unit by lifting the door up.

### NOTE

Place the door on a padded surface to prevent damage.

- Flip the door over to access the bottom. Using a Phillips<sup>™</sup> screwdriver remove the screws from the hinge bearing and the door closer (see Figure 3A).
- 7. Using a flat head screwdriver, gently pry the closer/bearing assembly out of the door (see Figure 3B).
- 8. Separate the door closer and hinge bearing (see Figure 3C).
- Flip the door closer over 180° and reinstall the closer onto the hinge bearing (see Figure 3D).
- Using a Phillips<sup>™</sup> screwdriver, attach the door closer/bearing assembly to the opposite side of the door (see Figure 3E).
- Remove the hinge cover by gently bending the tabs of the cover out while pulling the cover toward the front of the unit (see Figure 4).







### DOOR REMOVAL/REVERSAL (UNITS WITH TEMPERATURE CONTROL INSIDE)

- Using a Phillips<sup>™</sup> screwdriver, remove the screw from the door stop (see Figure 5A).
- Using a flat head screwdriver, gently pry the door stop off the bottom hinge pin (see Figure 5B).
- 14. Using a ratchet with a 12 mm socket, remove the bottom hinge pin (see Figure 5C).



- Reinstall the hinge pin into the outer hole and tighten with a ratchet and a 12 mm socket (see Figure 6A).
- Flip door stop over 180° (see Figure 6B) and reinstall onto the opposite hinge over the hinge pin (see Figure 6C).

With the assistance of another person, tilt the appliance back, to have access to the bottom hinge. Loosen the hinge screws slightly. flip the door stopper, and place it on top of the bottom hinge, making adjustments until the stopper is flush against the unit. Tighten all screws. (See Figure 7)

17. Secure the door stop with a screw (see Figure 6D).





### 12 DOOR REMOVAL/REVERSAL (UNITS WITH TEMPERATURE CONTROL INSIDE)

 Reinstall the hinge cover by gently bending the cover tabs outward, while sliding the cover over the hinge until it clicks into place (see Figure 8).

 Slide the door onto the bottom hinge pin at 90° to the freezer cabinet and close the door (see Figure 9).






- 20. Using a Phillips™ screwdriver or a 5/16" wrench, secure the top hinge using three 5/16" screws. Replace the top hinge cover (see Figure 10).
- Plug the freezer power cord back into the electrical outlet, and turn the freezer temperature control to the **Recommended** setting.



## DOOR REMOVAL/REVERSAL 13

### IMPORTANT

Before you begin, remove the electrical power cord from the wall outlet. Remove any food from door shelves.



### CAUTION

This procedure will require 2 people to safely perform.

- 1. Lay the unit down on its back.
- 2. Disconnect the small blue and white connectors located in the channel in the bottom of the door (see Figure 1A).
- Remove the gray cable from underneath the 2 harness retaining clips (see Figure 1B).
- 4. Pull the gray cable and connectors through the hinge hole located on the bottom of the cabinet using a flat-head screwdriver.
- 5. Route the gray cable and the connectors out from under the wheel axle and the wheel spacer (see Figure 2).






6. Slide the gray cable and connectors out of the plastic channel located on the bottom right side of the cabinet (see Figure 3).

7. Remove the bottom hinge using 5/16" (8mm) wrench (see Figure 4).






- Using a Phillips<sup>™</sup> screwdriver, remove the screws from the hinge bearing and the door closer (see Figure 5A).
- 9. Using a flathead screwdriver, gently pry the door closer/hinge bearing assembly out of the door (see Figure 5B).
- 10. Separate the door closer and hinge bearing (see Figure 5C).
- Flip the door closer over 180° and reinstall the door closer onto the hinge bearing (see Figure 5D).
- Using a Phillips<sup>™</sup> screwdriver, attach the door closer/hinge bearing assembly to the opposite side of the door (see Figure 5E).
- Remove the screw from the door stop located on the bottom hinge, using a Phillips™ screwdriver (see Figure 6A).
- Using a flathead screwdriver, gently pry the door stop off the bottom hinge pin (see Figure 6B)
- Using a ratchet with a 12 mm socket, remove the bottom hinge pin and install into the left hole (see Figure 6C).
- Flip the door stop over 180° and reinstall onto the bottom hinge pin. Secure the door stop with the screw (see Figure 6D).





### DOOR REMOVAL/REVERSAL (UNITS WITH TEMPERATURE CONTROL OUTSIDE)

- Remove the left bottom hinge using 5/16" (8 mm) wrench and install on the right side. Figure 7.
- 18. Reattach the bottom hinge (with the door stop) to the left side of the cabinet and add the wheel spacer on the left side of the wheel axle. Adjust the bottom hinge so the door stopper is flush with the front of the unit.



- Route the gray cable and connectors under the left side wheel axle and wheel spacer (see Figure 8B).
- 21. Route the connectors and gray cable through the left side hole in the hinge (see Figure 8C).
- 22. Insert the gray cable into the left side door channel in the bottom of the door (see Figure 8D).
- 23. Route the gray cable underneath the 2 harness retaining clips on the left side of the door channel.
- 24. Reconnect the blue and white connectors.
- Remove the hinge cover (see Figure 9A) and use a 5/16" wrench to remove the top hinge (see Figure 9B).






### **16** DOOR REMOVAL/REVERSAL (UNITS WITH TEMPERATURE CONTROL OUTSIDE)


- Pry out the hinge bearing from the top of the freezer door with a flathead screwdriver (see Figure 10A). Install the hinge bearing on the opposite side of the door (see Figure 10B).
- Reattach the top hinge (B) onto the left side of the cabinet, using a 5/16" wrench. Replace the top hinge cover (A) (see Figure 11).




### CAUTION

Raise the freezer to the upright position and allow 1 hour before plugging the unit back into electrical outlet.

28. Plug the freezer power cord back into the electrical outlet.

Wear gloves and use extreme CAUTION when installing these handles. The rounded end of the handles may be sharp.





### IMPORTANT

To ensure proper installation of handle, please review these instructions and illustrations thoroughly prior to installing the handle.

Additionally, before installing the door handle, make sure the door swing is correct. Your model will have either a right-hand or left-hand door swing. Follow **DOOR REVERSAL** instructions, if necessary.

- 1. Remove handle from carton and any other protective packaging.
- Position freezer handle end caps over upper and lower pre-installed shoulder bolts (A) that are fastened into door, ensuring the holes for the set screws are facing towards the hinge.
- While holding handle firmly against door, fasten upper and lower Allen set screws (B) with supplied Allen wrench.





### **18** CONTROLS AND SETTINGS (UNITS WITH TEMPERATURE CONTROL INSIDE)

### **Cool Down Period**

To ensure safe food storage, allow the appliance to operate with the door closed for at least 8 hours before loading it with food.

### **Appliance Control**


### 🕻 NOTE

When first turning appliance on, adjust control to **Recommended**. After 24 hours, adjust the controls as needed.

### $\rightarrow$

### IMPORTANT

Adjusting the appliance temperature control to **OFF** turns off the compressor and prevents the appliance from cooling but does not disconnect the power to the light bulb and other electrical components. To turn off power to your appliance, you must unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.



### **Temperature Adjustment**

Adjust the temperature gradually: adjust the knob in small increments, allowing the temperature to stabilize.

- For colder temperatures, adjust the knob toward **Coldest**.
- For warmer temperatures, adjust the knob toward **Cold**.

### Alarms

#### High Temp Alert

If the temperature increases above freezing your food, the LED light at the bottom of the cabinet flashes and the alarm sounds. You can reset the alarm by opening and then closing the door. The LED continues to flash until the cabinet temperature is below 23°F (-5°C). If the internal temperature remains high for 15 minutes and there has not been a power failure, call Frigidaire at 1-800-374-4432 for assistance.

#### Door Ajar Alert

This alert sounds to alert you the door has been open for 5 minutes or more. The audible alert sounds until you close the door.

#### Power On Light

The green LED Power On light indicates the appliance is properly connected to electrical power. The light glows even when the temperature control is turned to OFF. If the light goes out, refer to **Appliance does not run** in **TROUBLESHOOTING**.

### Sabbath Mode

The Sabbath Mode is a feature that disables portions of the appliance and its controls in accordance with observance of the weekly Sabbath and religious holidays within the Orthodox Jewish community.

The Sabbath Mode disables the temperature control knob and mutes all sounds (except the High Temp alert). The LED light at the botton of the cabinet flashes and the High Temp alert sounds until you deactivate the Sabbath Mode.

### 

The temperature setting is not affected by the Sabbath Mode. For food safety, the High Temp alert sounds for 10 minutes if the internal temperature increases. After 10 minutes, the alarm stops, but the LED light at the bottom of the cabinet continues to flash until you deactivate the Sabbath Mode.


#### To enter Sabbath Mode

Rotate the temperature control knob to **OFF**, and then between **Recommended** and **OFF** 3 times within 10 seconds. A beep sounds indicating the unit is in Sabbath Mode. Rotate the temperature control knob to the desired temperature setting. The interior light will not illuminate while in Sabbath Mode when the door is open.



Delay 1 second after each rotation of temperature control knob.

OFF → Recommended → OFF → Recommended → OFF → Recommended



To exit Sabbath Mode, repeat the steps above.



While in the Sabbath Mode, the lights will not work until you deactivate Sabbath Mode.

The appliance stays in Sabbath Mode after power failure recovery. You must deactivate it with the temperature control knob.

### **Cool Down Period**


To ensure safe food storage, allow the appliance to operate with the door closed for at least 8 hours before loading it with food.

#### Power On

Plugging in the appliance for the first time causes an audible alert and the **Recommended** temp setting LED to illuminate.

#### Temp

Pressing **Temp**<sup>\*</sup> allows you to scroll through the 5 temperature settings from **Cold** (top) to **Coldest** (bottom), and then loop back to **Cold**.



## CONTROLS AND SETTINGS 21

#### Freeze Boost

Prior to grocery shopping, activate **Freeze Boost** so upon returning you can ensure your newly purchased frozen food will be preserved as quickly as possible.

Turning on **Freeze Boost** cools the appliance down to a target temperature and remains active for up to 24 hours before automatically deactivating or being manually exited.

To turn the function off, press **Freeze Boost**. When you turn the function off, it automatically resets the freezer back to the previous temperature setting.

### Alarms

#### **High Temp Alert**

If the temperature increases above freezing your food, the red **High Temp** LED light illuminates and the alarm sounds. Reset the alarm by pressing and holding **Temp** for 3 seconds.

### IMPORTANT

If the high temp condition has not improved after a period of time, the alert displays again. In this event, repeat steps for resetting the alert and call Frigidaire at 1-800-374-4432 for assistance

#### Power Failure

In the event of a power failure, where the temperature increases above freezing your food, once you restore power, the red **High Temp** LED light illuminates, and the alarm sounds. Reset the alarm by pressing and holding **Temp** for 3 seconds.

### 🕻 🛛 NOTE

If a power failure occurs, frozen foods stay frozen longer if you keep the appliance closed. If the power failure continues, pack 7 or 8 lbs of dry ice into the unit every 24 hours. Look in the Yellow Pages under "Dry Ice," "Dairies," or "Ice Cream Manufacturers" for local dry ice suppliers. Always wear gloves and use caution when handling dry ice.

#### Door Ajar Alert

If the door is open for 5 minutes or more, an alert sounds until you close the door.

### Sabbath Mode

The Sabbath Mode is a feature that disables portions of the appliance and its controls in accordance with observance of the weekly Sabbath and religious holidays within the Orthodox Jewish community.


All buttons are disabled, and all sounds (except the High Temp alert\*) are muted. Only the High Temp alert will illuminate until you deactivate the Sabbath Mode.

#### 

The temperature setting is not affected by the Sabbath Mode. For food safety, the High Temp alert will sound for 10 minutes if the internal temperature increases. After 10 minutes, the alarm will stop, but the High Temp LED will remain lit until you deactivate the Sabbath Mode.

#### To enter Sabbath Mode

Press and hold the **Temp** and **Freeze Boost** buttons simultaneously for 5 seconds. One LED on each side of **Recommended** setting will be lit while the unit is in Sabbath mode.




To exit Sabbath Mode, repeat the steps above.

### Shelves (vary by model)


Easily adjust appliance shelves to suit individual needs. Before adjusting the shelves, remove all food.

**To adjust shelves,** lift the front of the shelf and pull forward.

**To replace shelves,** insert the rear of the shelf into any pair of shelf rails and carefully push the shelf back into position, making sure the shelf clips go in the notch in the liner.

### **Door Storage**

Door bins and shelves conveniently store jars, bottles, and cans. You can quickly select frequently used items.

#### To remove the door bin:

- 1. Push in on each side of the door bin to release it from the locking tabs.
- 2. Lift up on the bin and pull it straight out.


#### To install the door bins:

- 1. Push the bin back and down into the locking tabs.
- 2. The bin sides will lock into the tabs.



### Freezer Basket (some models)

The freezer basket is ideal for large items or items that do not store well on the shelves.



# **24** CARE AND CLEANING

### Protecting your investment

Keeping your appliance clean maintains appearance and prevents odor build-up. Wipe up any spills immediately and clean the appliance at least twice a year. When cleaning, take the following precautions:

- Always unplug the electrical power cord from the wall outlet before cleaning.
- Never use CHLORIDE or cleaners with bleach to clean stainless steel.
- Do not wash any removable parts in a dishwasher.
- Remove adhesive labels by hand. Do not use razor blades or other sharp instruments which can scratch the appliance surface.
- Do not remove the serial plate.
