WARNING

To reduce the risk of explosion, fire, death, electric shock, scalding or injury to persons when using this
product, follow basic precautions, including the following:

Installation

- Make sure the cooktop is properly installed and grounded by a qualified installer, according to the Installation Instructions. Any adjustment and service should be performed only by qualified gas range installers or service technicians.
- Plug the cooktop into a 120-volt grounded outlet only. Do not remove the round grounding prong from the plug. If in doubt about the grounding of the home electrical system, it is your personal responsibility and obligation to have an ungrounded outlet replaced with a properly grounded, three-prong outlet in accordance with the National Electrical Code. Do not use an extension cord with this cooktop.
- To prevent fire hazard or electrical shock, do not use an adapter plug, an extension cord, or remove the grounding prong from the electrical power cord. Failure to follow this warning can cause serious injury, fire or death.
- This appliance is equipped with a three-prong grounding plug for your protection against shock hazard and should be plugged directly into a properly grounded receptacle. Do not cut or remove the grounding prong from this plug.
- Make sure all packaging materials are removed from the cooktop before operating it to prevent fire or smoke damage should the packaging material ignite.
- Make sure the cooktop is properly adjusted by a qualified service technician or installer for the type of gas (natural or LP) that is to be used. The cooktop can be converted for use with either type of gas. See the Installation Instructions.

- These adjustments must be done by a qualified service technician according to the manufacturer's instructions and all codes and requirements of the authority having jurisdiction. Failure to follow these instructions could result in serious injury or property damage. The qualified agency performing this work assumes responsibility for the conversion.
- Remove all tape and packing materials before using the cooktop. Dispose of all plastic bags after unpacking the cooktop. Never allow children to play with packing materials.
- Improper installation, adjustment, alteration, service or maintenance can cause injury or property damage. For assistance or additional information, consult a qualified installer, service agency, manufacturer (dealer) or your gas supplier.
- Never reuse old flexible connectors. The use of old flexible connectors can cause gas leaks and personal
 injury. Always use NEW flexible connectors when installing a gas appliance.
- This appliance must not be installed with a ventilation system that blows air downward toward the cooktop. This type of ventilation system may cause ignition and combustion problems with the gas cooking appliance resulting in personal injury or unintended operation.
- Ask the installer to show you the location of the cooktop gas shut-off valve and how to shut it off if necessary.
- Before servicing, disconnect the electrical supply.

Operation

WARNING

- NEVER use the cooktop as a space heater to heat or warm the room. Doing so may result in carbon monoxide poisoning and overheating of the cooktop.
- Gas appliances can cause minor exposure to four potentially hazardous substances, namely benzene, carbon monoxide, formaldehyde and soot, caused primarily by the improper combustion of natural or LP gas.
- Correctly adjusted burners, indicated by a blue rather than a yellow flame, will minimize improper combustion. Exposure to these substances can be minimized by opening windows or using a ventilation fan or hood.
- Do not place or use combustible materials, gasoline or other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity of this or any other appliance.
- Stepping, leaning or sitting on this cooktop can result in serious injuries and cause damage to the cooktop.
- Do not leave children alone or unattended where a cooktop is hot or in operation. They could be seriously burned.
- Do not allow children to climb or play around the cooktop.
- Let the burner grates and other surfaces cool before touching them or leaving them where children can reach them.
- Items of interest to children should not be stored in cabinets above a cooktop children climbing on the cooktop to reach items could be seriously injured.
- Do not let anyone climb or stand on the cooktop. They could damage the cooktop or tip it over, causing severe personal injury.
- Never wear loose fitting or hanging garments while using the appliance. Be careful when reaching for items placed in cabinets over the cooktop. Flammable material could be ignited if brought into contact with flame or hot surfaces and may cause severe burns.
- Do not place flammable materials on or near the cooktop.
- Do not use water on grease fires. NEVER touch a flaming pan. Turn the controls off. Smother a flaming pan on a surface burner by covering the pan completely with a well-fitting lid, cookie sheet or flat tray. Use a multi-purpose dry chemical or foam-type fire extinguisher. Flaming grease outside a pan can be

put out by covering it with baking soda or, if available, by using a multi-purpose dry chemical or foamtype fire extinguisher.

- If the top burner flame goes out, gas is still flowing to the burner until the knob is turned to the **OFF** position. Do not leave the burners **ON** unattended.
- **Use proper pan size**. Do not use pans that are unstable or easily tipped. Select cookware having flat bottoms large enough to cover burner grates. To avoid spills, make sure cookware is large enough to contain the food properly. This will save cleaning time and prevent hazardous accumulations of food. Because heavy spattering or spills left on a range can ignite, use pans with handles that can be easily grasped and remain cool.
- Never leave the surface burners unattended at high flame settings. Boilovers can cause smoking and greasy spillovers may catch on fire.
- Control the top burner flame size so it does not extend beyond the edge of the cookware. Excessive flame is hazardous.
- Use only dry pot holders—moist or damp pot holders on hot surfaces may result in burns from steam.
 Do not let pot holders come near open flames when lifting cookware. Do not use a towel or other bulky cloth instead of a pot holder.
- To prevent burns, ignition of flammable materials and spillage, turn cookware handles toward the side or back of the cooktop without extending over adjacent burners.
- NEVER place any items on the cooktop. The hot air from the vent may ignite flammable items and will increase pressure in closed containers, which may cause them to burst.
- Do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity of this or any other appliance.
- Storage on Appliance Flammable materials should not be stored on the cooktop or near surface units. This includes paper, plastic and cloth items, such as cookbooks, plasticware and towels, as well as flammable liquids.
- Carefully watch foods being fried at a high flame setting.
- Always heat fat slowly, and watch as it heats.
- Use a deep fat thermometer if possible to prevent overheating fat beyond the smoking point.
- Use the least possible amount of fat for effective shallow or deep-fat frying. Filling the pan too full of fat can cause spillovers when food is added.
- LG does not recommend using a gas cooktop for the preparation of flaming foods. If you choose to prepare flaming foods under a hood, turn the fan on.
- To prevent burns, always be sure that the controls for all burners are at the **OFF** position and all grates are cool before attempting to remove them.
- If you smell gas, turn off the gas to the cooktop and call a qualified service technician. Never use an open flame to locate a leak.
- Do not place cooking oils or other flammable materials on or near the cooktop.
- Always turn knob to the **OFF** position before removing cookware.
- Do not store explosives, such as aerosol cans, on or near the cooktop. Flammable materials may explode and result in fire or property damage.
- Do not obstruct the flow of combustion and ventilation air.
- Do not block the airflow into or out of the cooktop. It is necessary for proper combustion and ventilation.
- Always turn knobs to the LITE position when igniting the top burners and make sure the burners have ignited.
- If frying a combination of oils or fats, stir together before heating or as fats slowly melt.
- Liquids such as water, coffee or tea are able to be overheated beyond the boiling point without
 appearing to be boiling, due to surface tension of the liquid. Visible bubbling or boiling is not always
 present when the container is removed from the cooktop. This could result in very hot liquids suddenly
 boiling over when the container is disturbed or a spoon or other utensil is inserted into the liquid.
 To reduce the risk of injury to persons

- Do not overheat the liquid.
- Stir the liquid both before and halfway through heating it.
- Do not use straight-sided containers with narrow necks.
- After heating, allow the container to stand on the cooktop for a short time before moving the container.
- Use extreme care when inserting a spoon or other utensil into the container after heating.

Maintenance

- Do not attempt to repair or replace any part of the cooktop unless it is specifically mentioned in this manual. All other service should be referred to a qualified technician.
- Clean the cooktop with caution. If a wet sponge or cloth is used to wipe spills on a hot cooktop, be careful to avoid steam burns.
- Leak testing of the appliance must be conducted according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Do not lift the cooktop. Lifting the cooktop can cause damage and improper operation of the cooktop.
- If the cooktop is located near a window, do not hang long curtains that could blow over the surface burners and catch on fire.


Operation

- To prevent poor air circulation, place the cooktop out of the kitchen traffic path and away from drafty locations.
- If using glass cookware, make sure it is designed for top-of-range cooking.
- If frying mixtures of oils or fats, stir to combine before heating.
- Do not use a wok on the surface burners if the wok has a round metal ring that is placed over the burner
 grate to support the wok. This ring acts as a heat trap, which may damage the burner grate and burner
 head. Also, it may cause the burner to work improperly. This may cause a carbon monoxide level above
 that allowed by current standards, resulting in a health hazard.
- Foods for frying should be as dry as possible. Frost or moisture on foods can cause hot fat to bubble up and over the sides of the pan.
- Never try to move a pan of hot fat, especially a deep fat fryer. Wait until the fat is cool.
- Do not place plastic items on the cooktop—they may melt if left too close to the vent.
- · Keep all plastics away from the surface burners.
- To avoid burns, do not clean the cooktop surface until it has cooled.



OPERATION

Using the Surface Burners


Before Using the Surface Burners

Throughout this manual, features and appearance may vary from your model.

- Make sure all grates on the cooktop are properly placed before using any burner.
- Be sure the burners and grates are cool before you place your hand, a pot holder, cleaning cloths or other materials on them.
- · Make sure all burners are in place.
- Do not operate the burner for an extended period of time without cookware on the grate.
 The finish on the grate may chip without cookware to absorb the heat.

Lighting a Gas Surface Burner

- Push the control knob of the burner that you wish to light and turn it counterclockwise to LITE.
- When turning a burner to LITE, all the burners spark. Do not attempt to disassemble or clean around any burner while another burner is on. An electric shock may result, which could cause you to knock over hot cookware.



- If you keep the control knob held down, the automatic ignition for the burner will operate.
- You should hold down the control knob for 15 seconds after the flame on the burner has lit. If after 15 seconds the burner has not lit, stop operating the device and ventilate the area and/ or wait at least 1 minute before attempting a further ignition of the burner.
- After this 15 second interval, to regulate the flame you should continue turning the control knob counterclockwise until the flame is at a suitable level. The operating position must be at a position between HI and LO.
- To switch the burner off, turn the control knob fully clockwise to the gas off position.

• In case of power failure, the burners can be lit by carefully using a match.

In Case of Power Failure

- In case of a power failure, you can light the gas surface burners on the cooktop with a match. Hold a lit match to the burner, then push in and turn the control knob to the LITE position. Use extreme caution when lighting burners this way.
- Surface burners in use when an electrical power failure occurs will continue to operate normally.

Automatic Ignition with Flame Failure Safety Device (Gas Control)

 The appliance is fitted with a flame failure safety device on each burner, which is designed to stop the flow of gas to the burner head in the event of the flame going out.

Safety and Energy Saving

The diameter of the bottom of the pan should correspond to that of the burner.

CAUTION

- Be careful! When you use oversize cookware, the surface around the product may be overheated. Use the cookware as described below.
- Do not use cookware that overlaps the edge of the burner.

Correct

· Always use cookware that is suitable for each burner to avoid wasting gas and discoloring the cookware.



Place a lid on the cookware.



· Only use pots, saucepans and frying pans with a thick, flat bottom.



· Center cookware on the grate over the burner head.



· Handle cookware carefully when it is on the burner.



Incorrect

• Do not use small-diameter cookware on large burners. The flame should never come up the sides of the cookware.



· Avoid cooking without a lid or with the lid half open as this wastes energy



• Do not use a pan with a convex or concave bottom.



• Do not place cookware on one side of a burner, as it could tip over. Do not use cookware with a large diameter on the burners near the controls. If cookware sits too close to the controls or

touches them, the increased heat can damage the controls.



• Never place cookware directly on top of the burner or burner cap.



• Do not place anything, such as a heat diffuser or asbestos mat, between the cookware and the grate, as it may cause serious damage to the appliance.



 Do not use excessive weight and do not hit the cooktop with heavy objects.



▲ CAUTION

- Do not use roasting pans, frying pans or grill stones heated simultaneously on several burners because the resulting heat build-up may damage the appliance.
- Do not touch cooktop surfaces while cooking or after cooking until they cool down.

NOTE

 As soon as a liquid starts boiling, turn down the flame to keep the liquid simmering.

Selecting Flame Size

NEVER let the flames extend up the sides of the cookware.

Watch the flame, not the knob, while reducing the heat. When fast heating is desired, the flame size on a gas burner should match the cookware used.

Flames larger than the bottom of the cookware will not result in faster heating of the cookware and could be hazardous.



Cookware

Aluminum

Medium-weight cookware is recommended because it heats quickly and evenly. Most of the foods brown evenly in an aluminum skillet. Use sauce pans with tight fitting lids when cooking with minimum amounts of water.

Copper

An excellent heat conductor but discolors easily.

Cast-Iron

If heated slowly, most skillets will give satisfactory results.

Stainless Steel

This metal alone has poor heating properties and is usually combined with copper, aluminum or other metals for improved heat distribution. Combination metal skillets usually work satisfactorily if they are used with medium heat as the manufacturer recommends.

Enamelware

Under some conditions, the enamel of some cookware may melt. Follow cookware manufacturer's recommendations for cooking methods.

Glass

There are two types of glass cookware - those for oven use only and those for top of the range cooking (saucepans, coffee and teapots). Glass conducts heat very slowly.

· Heatproof Glass Ceramic

Can be used for either surface or oven cooking. It conducts heat very slowly and cools very slowly. Check cookware manufacturer's directions to be sure it can be used on gas ranges.

Using a Wok

Do not use a wok support ring. Placing the ring over the burner or grate may cause the burner to work improperly, resulting in carbon monoxide levels above allowable standards.

This can be a health hazard.

Use a 14 inch or smaller flat bottom wok. Make sure the wok bottom sits flat on the grate.

Woks are available at a local retail store.

Only a flat-bottomed wok should be used.



Stove-Top Grills

Do not use stove top grills on the surface burners. Using the stove top grill on the surface burner will cause incomplete combustion and can result in exposure to carbon monoxide levels above allowable current standards.



This can be a health hazard.

MAINTENANCE

Care and Cleaning

Make sure that the electrical power is off and all surfaces are cool before cleaning any part of the cooktop.

Cleaning the Appliance

CAUTION

- · Cleaning operations must only be carried out when the appliance is completely cool.
- The appliance should be disconnected from the main supply before commencing any cleaning process.
- Clean the appliance regularly, preferably after each use.
- · Abrasive cleaners or sharp objects will damage the appliance surface; you should clean it using water and a little mild soap.
- Do not clean the control knobs or grate in a dishwasher.
- Do not spray cleansers directly onto the control panel. Moisture entering the electric circuits may cause electric shock or product damage.

Grate and Control Knobs

· Take off the grate.

- Clean the grate and the control knobs with a damp cloth, mild soap and warm water. For stubborn soiling, soak beforehand.
- Dry everything with a clean soft cloth.

Cooktop Surface

- Regularly wipe over the cooktop surface using a soft cloth well wrung-out in warm water to which a little mild soap has been added.
- · Dry the cooktop surface thoroughly after cleaning.
- Thoroughly remove salty foods or liquids from the cooktop as soon as possible to avoid the risk of corrosion.
- Stainless steel parts of the appliance may become discolored over time. This is normal because of the high temperatures. Each time the appliance is used, these parts should be cleaned with a product that is suitable for stainless steel.
- When you finish cooking, ensure that the panel and accessories have cooled down completely before removing the grate, burner heads and caps.
- Do not allow liquids such as vinegar, coffee, milk, salt water, lemon or tomato juice to come in contact with stainless steel parts for extended periods of time.

WARNING

Be careful. The water can be hot.

NOTE

- Use of abrasive powders or abrasive cleaners may cause scratches.
- Be careful. Do not use excessive force when cleaning the product. This can lead to scratches.
- Be careful. Do not allow water to enter the top ring.
- Clean the stainless steel cooktop surface immediately after use. It will be difficult to clean completely if it is very dirty.


Burners

- Remove the burner heads and caps by pulling them upwards and away from the cooktop.
- Soak them in hot water and a little detergent or mild soap.

- After cleaning and washing the burner heads and caps, wipe and dry them carefully. Make sure that the flame holes are clean and completely dry.
- Wipe the fixed parts of the burner cup with a damp cloth and dry afterwards.
- · Gently wipe the ignition device and flame supervision device with a well wrung-out cloth and wipe dry with a clean cloth.
- Do not attempt to remove the ignition device from the cooktop or burner bases.
- Before placing the burners back on the cooktop surface, make sure that the injector is not blocked.

Reassemble the Auxiliary, Semi-Rapid, Rapid and Triple-Crown Burners as follows:

- Place the flame spreader **4** onto the burner cup **5** so that the ignition device and the flame supervision device extend through their respective holes in the flame spreader. The flame spreader must click into place correctly.
- 2 Position the burner caps (1, 2, 3) onto the flame speader 4 so that the retaining pins fit into their respective recesses.



CAUTION

- · Replace parts in the correct order after cleaning.
 - Do not mix up the top and bottom.

- The locating pins must fit exactly into the notches.

Before Calling for Service

In the event that you "Opt Out", the law of the province or territory of your residence shall govern this Limited Warranty and any disputes between you and LG except to the extent that such law is preempted by or inconsistent with applicable federal or provincial/territorial law. Should arbitration not be permitted for any claim, action, dispute or controversy between you and LG, you and LG agree to attorn to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the province or territory of your residence for the resolution of the claim, action, dispute or controversy between you and LG.

You may only opt out of the dispute resolution procedure in the manner described above (that is, by e-mail or telephone); no other form of notice will be effective to opt out of this dispute resolution procedure. Opting out of this dispute resolution procedure will not affect the coverage of the Limited Warranty in any way, and you will continue to enjoy the full benefits of the Limited Warranty. If you keep this product and do not opt out, then you accept all terms and conditions of the arbitration provision described above.

Conflict of Terms. In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between the terms of this Limited Warranty and the End User License Agreement ("EULA") in regards to dispute resolution, the terms of this Limited Warranty shall control and govern the rights and obligations of the parties and shall take precedence over the EULA.
